The end of June was a busy month at Headquarters as preparation got underway to move the Federation Headquarters from their 11 year old spot in New Jersey to a new location in the same town. Many hours of planning and packing went into the transition. All inventory items were placed in a newly leased storage facility nearby. ### INTERNATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP IN LONDON, ENGLAND

Rousing cheers of "Tang Soo" could be heard from coast to coast as U.S. team trials for the Tang Soo Do Moo Duk Kwan International Championships were held simultaneously in Scranton, Pa., and Los Angeles, Ca., on May 17th, 1986.

These trials determined who competed in the Internationals in London, England, on August 1st, 2nd, and 3rd, 1986. Master H.C. Hwang, Chairman of the Technical Advisory Committee stated, "I know we fielded a very strong team."

The official U.S. Team competed against teams from England, Italy, Greece, the Phillipines, Brazil, Argentina, Germany, Belgium, the Netherlands, Malaysia, Brunei, and Indonesia.

The teams are all a part of the Korean Soo Bahk Do (Tang Soo Do) Moo Duk Kwan Association, a world-wide organization founded by the Grandmaster Hwang Kee in 1945. The Grandmaster was on hand to observe the competition which was hosted by Master Kang Uk Lee, 8th Dan, in Watford, England; near London.

Winners of the U.S. trials, and representing the United States were Heavyweight; Russell Colston, 3rd Dan, Biloxi, MS. and Mon-Ya Hawkins, 1st Dan, Cerritos, Ca., Middleweight; Moshe Jakob, 1st Dan, Springfield, N.J., and Anthony Ah Po, 3rd Dan, Orange Vale, Ca., Lightweight; Daymon Kenyon, 3rd Dan San Diego, Ca., and David Sgro, 2nd Dan, Connecticut. Women's Division; Lisa Kozak, 2nd Dan, Olmsted, Ohio, and Pamela Seyffert, 1st Dan, Fountain Valley, Ca. The official U.S. Form Team consisted of; Phil Duncan, 3rd Dan, Henderson, TX, Kris Poole, 3rd Dan, Longview, TX, and Ted Smith, 3rd Dan, Tyler, TX.

The contestants were accompanied to England by Master H.C. Hwang, Chairman of the Technical Advisory Committee and the Grandmaster's U.S. Designee, and Master Ted Mason, Chairman of the Board of Directors.

Grandmaster Hwang Kee said that the International Competition gave us "the opportunity to devote the knowledge and discipline earned through Tang Soo Do Moo Duk Kwan to the achievement of peace and happiness for all human beings in the world through international understanding." As we went to press, photos from England were not available. Look for a full roster of International Championship photos in the upcoming issue of the newsletter.
