Dr. Amanda Austin is currently serving Iberville Parish as the Director of the Iberville Math, Science, and Arts (MSA) Academy East in St. Gabriel. MSA Academy East is the magnet program of East Iberville High School. With 15 years of experience, her extensive knowledge of STEAM academic and extracurricular programming, in elementary, middle, and high school settings made this position a best fit. Dr. Austin's career in education did not start with her taking the traditional route. She earned a Bachelors in Sociology with a concentration in Criminology with a minor in African and African American Studies from Louisiana State University, alternative teaching certification and a Master of Arts in Teaching from Louisiana College, as well as gained an endorsement for Educational Leadership from McNeese State University. She also pursued a Doctor of Education degree in Educational Leadership from Lamar University. One of Dr. Austin's proudest professional achievements was being selected as the Principal to reopen North (berville High School (NIHS) after the school had been shuttered for over a decade. With community support, input from district leadership, and full hiring autonomy, NIHS is a thriving traditional school with a STEM magnet program. With her recent participation in the Louisiana Superintendent's Academy and acceptance into ASCD's Champion in Education cohort, Dr. Austin continuously strives to grow as an instructional leader and expects to lead her school to meet or exceed each student's individual growth target. One of the most important principles that I live and breathe as an educational leader is collective efficacy. Collective efficacy is a shared belief that together we can achieve high achievement that positively affects student outcomes. When it comes to growing and enhancing educational outcomes for stakeholders within a school building, it is shared/ distributive leadership that is the driving force of the school. If all stakeholders associated believe that we can and will achieve our goals, we will be unstoppable academic institution that produces students that are ready and prepared to for college and/or career, teachers who are leaders in their own rights and embody the teaching profession in its highest regard, and ultimate create thriving communities within our great state of Louisiana.

From honing my skills as an instructional leader, soaking in the wisdom and guidance from NIET, to effectively using Master and Mentor Teachers to drive instructional practices in the classroom, I engage students and teachers of all backgrounds and abilities in effective teaching and learning in a myriad of ways that directly impact student achievement and teacher wellbeing. My instructional leadership team meets weekly to determine the best next steps for our campus and in Cluster to increase student achievement in the classrooms by equipping our teachers with the best practices for teaching and learning.

Being at a smaller school means that we have to be intentional about the courses we offer in our master schedule, the college courses such as Advanced Placement and Dual Enrollment courses offered, and Jumpstart Pathways offered from year to year. Our goal for students is for them to graduate with an industry-based credential in one hand and college credits in another hand. Also, we intentionally use our response to intervention/enrichment period that we call W.I.N. (What I Need) to intentionally focus on skills that were missed from a previous grade level or move them ahead to a more challenging standard.

Asking teachers to stretch themselves inside the classroom could not be accomplished until I truly learned each teachers "why." Why did they become an educator? What inspired them daily to create core memories for their students? I schedule 30-minute visits with every faculty and staff member. These personal conversations with educators allow me to learn their likes and dislikes, ease any anxieties they hold for the upcoming school year, and ultimately voice any concerns or request changes. As a leader, I listen and give them an opportunity to use their voice as it is their campus as much as it is the students' campus. These moments are impactful, and I refer to them throughout the school year. This has been helpful with our teacher retention. Teachers feel valued and ultimately remain on our campus where the administration pours into their craft through teacher leadership opportunities and professional development. Also, teachers are given an opportunity to engage in the spending of school funds for their classroom needs. They receive a spreadsheet at the beginning of the year entitled, 'Needs, Wishes, Professional Development, and Technology'. Teachers appreciate the transparency and the use of aligned funds to teacher and student needs.

Another way I engage students of all backgrounds and abilities in effective teaching and learning is by creating opportunities for students to set academic, behavioral, and social emotional goals each nine weeks marking period. With assistance from the teacher and the administration, we sit down for student conferences where they set goals at the beginning of the nine weeks and reflect on their progress at the end of the same nine weeks. When we have parents/ teachers, students can lead those conversations, because they have been included in the process from the beginning of the year,

It is my belief that working as a highly functioning team, teacher autonomy and ownership, and the inclusion of students in the goal setting process that setting high expectations can increase student and teacher achievement. These beliefs were turned into action as I was the inaugural principal of North Iberville High School's reopening in August of 2022 where we had highest ratings in 3-8 and high school assessment and progress/ student growth in the Iberville Parish school district with an overall score of C. As their school leader, I am proud of the work that was accomplished on the behalf of the students and staff of North Iberville, and I know that this solid foundation will continue to improve teaching and learning practices.

Add Reflection Response Two Here:

Empowering my students and teachers to form connections with the community has been transformative at both North Iberville High School that I led last school year and at the Iberville Math, Science, and Arts Academy- East where I currently lead this school year. In both rural communities, I immersed myself in learning what resources were available or unavailable, and where the school could possibly fill any gaps. I understood this powerful connection between community and school was of our most valuable resources and wanted to communicate their value back to them.

Last school year, I was the inaugural Principal who reopened North Iberville High School (NIHS). North Iberville High School was shuttered in 2008-2009 leaving the communities of Grosse Tete, Rosedale, and Maringioun devastated. After the school board voted on its reopening in April of 2022, I began to assemble a team that would assist me in seeking community input on what the school should look and feel like, especially from alumni members in the area. We asked for old photos, uniforms, trophies, and more. We wanted to bring back a sense of pride to this community. In addition, we added athletic teams to our school programming where we called on alumni to come out and support. The response was overwhelming! Alumni began to return to North Iberville High School and began to ask what they could do and how they could support. Not only was the faculty and staff surprised by the support, but the students in the building began to see their parents on campus more. Community members would come to donate their time on Moving Forward Mondays which was an initiative of the Superintendent where we would open our doors to all community, business, and industry partners. Athletics may have drawn some community members in, but it was the relationships between these stakeholders that transformed the school.

North Iberville High School is now a Capturing Kids' Hearts National Showcase School. Capturing Kids' Hearts is all about building meaningful relationships. At the beginning of the implementation of Capturing Kids' Hearts, we started to see how relationships transformed the culture and climate of our campus. When visitors walked through the front doors, our student ambassadors gave them a tour of the school. It was amazing to see students proud of their school, the course offerings made available to them, and how they enjoyed coming everyday, because they knew their teachers were looking for them. These relationships do not end at graduation but continue through our graduates' lives.

We also instituted Club Day on our campus. Club Day was our way of ensuring every student had a strong sense of community and belonging. Teachers selected activities that interested them and students matched themselves to those same interests. Students from middle and high school selected two clubs that they would be members of throughout the school year. Once a month both teachers and students took a "break" from traditional learning to engage in extracurricular activities such as Anime Club, Classic Board Games Club, Spanish Club, Youth Legislature/ National History Day Club, and more. We also took it a step further and invited community and business partners to either sponsor a club or join the club for a day of fun. This sense of play increased the bonds between stakeholders on our campus and became one incentive to promote and increase student attendance.

Post Covid, we continued with our virtual school assemblies. These assemblies allowed us to access community and business partners virtually where they shared innovative ideas, demonstrations, and guest speakers with our school community. Individuals such as Dr. Steve Steve Caparotta, Meteorologist, Dr. Calvin Mackie, STEM NOLA Founder, Shaeeta Williams, LSU Director of Basketball Operations, and many more "entered" our school through Google Meets each week and shared life experiences with our students.

Positive and meaningful connections with the community can dissolve walls or barriers and impact student learning and success for all students. Working in small rural communities such as North Iberville High School last year and now the Iberville Math, Science, and Arts Academy-East, community connections are essential. Unfortunately, students living in rural areas may lack access to science, technology, engineering, arts, and mathematics (STEAM) hands-on activities and demonstrations, field trip experiences, and experts in those fields, so bridging the gap between school and community has always been one of my top priorities. My philosophy as a school leader is, if I can not bring my students there, then I will bring them here, to my students.





As a school leader for the past 8 years, I have learned that every situation I encounter requires me to utilize a different skill set or quality. Every student, teacher, or parent may need me for a different reason, and my ability to be flexible yet understanding has served me well. My most unique or "strongest" qualities are ability to build meaningful relationships, inspire others to see beyond any obstacle (mentorship), and my ability to adapt to any situation that I am faced with as a school leader.

My ability to build, create, and foster meaningful relationships with all stakeholders at my school, district, and community is my strongest quality. One of my top priorities has always been to observe my surroundings and make meaningful connections in order to learn and support all stakeholders. I have always demonstrated the gentle balance between leading from the front where I am visible, taking control, and guiding others toward a common goal and leading from behind where I guide and support others to be their best selves personally and professionally. Having experience with being new to a community as a school leader, I have held listening sessions with students, teachers, and parents where empathy and compassion have been my guiding principles. When others feel they are truly heard, meaningful change can take place.

Another strength is my ability to mentor others who aspire to be school leaders both in my school building and around the State of Louisiana. For the past 8 years both inside and outside of school hours, I have mentored aspiring teachers into leadership roles in their districts. I have experience working for both Advanced Innovative Education (now dissolved) and APEL's Transformative Educational Leadership (TEL) programs. I can remember my mentors investing their wisdom and experiences with me when I began my teaching career in Calcasieu Parish. They provided me with opportunities outside of the classroom to lead a STEM Night or facilitate our partner in education meetings. Lastly, I have learned how to adapt my leadership style to meet the needs of those in need. Adaptability is an important quality I have learned through my years in education. Students have asked me before if I was the school counselor or social worker, because when a student is in a mental health crisis and needs to be heard, I am going to stop what I am going to listen to them. When a teacher wants to try something new but is hesitant and needs someone to give them feedback or ask me to show them a new strategy, I put my teacher hat on and modeled for them. Or when a parent does not know what to do with their child academically, behaviorally, or emotionally, I become a part of their village, and we brainstorm ways or resources to help their child. Being a school leader changes on a daily, sometimes hourly basis. Every day is different, but I have found purpose in educating the children of Louisiana.

I would leverage these qualities to positively impact the role of State Principal of the Year to create a pipeline for teacher leaders who aspire to move into leadership roles. Those roles can be that of Mentor Teacher, Master Teacher, Assistant Principal, or Instructional Leader. 



I am who I am today because of every teacher, parent, student, and community partner in education that embraced me, challenged me, and helped me grow as a school leader. Every stakeholder that I have crossed paths with holds a crucial piece of the puzzle that make up our great State and the state of our educational system. We must stop working in silos and work together to ensure the children of Louisiana have every tool they need to be successful to not only compete locally, but globally. By working together, we can ensure our students are prepared for a rapidly changing world.

I did not take the traditional route to become a principal. I started off as an uncertified teacher who held a degree in Criminology with full intentions of going to law school. The spring semester of college my senior year, I took a service-learning course that partnered with a nearby elementary school. It was through my experiences at that school and with a certain 5th grade math teacher that I found my purpose and passion for education. I obtained my alternative certification during my first year of teaching at a small elementary school with about 250 students and one school bus. Majority of the students walked to a local housing development. It was there that I learned curriculum, lesson planning, classroom management and more. I cannot remember what I taught or how much my students learned, but one thing I do know is that they changed my life. It was within my first three years of teaching that I knew in order to create meaningful and long-lasting change that I wanted to one day be a school leader. I wanted to create opportunities that would enhance the lives of my students.

In the fall of 2022, I was given an opportunity of a lifetime. I was tasked with reopening a rural high school that was shut down a decade prior due to low enrollment, lack of staff, and failing test scores. This school was set to have a science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) focus. Initially, I believed this to be a daunting task, and we faced some challenges, but with a team of like-minded individuals that made up my leadership team and teaching staff, we did not let any barriers that could have prevented success stop us from reopening and reviving this community school. In partnership with the district and our community, we reopened North Iberville High School with academic success as our priority along with athletics. We vowed to bring STEM to life daily through meaningful hands-on demonstrations, a variety of rigorous course offerings, and field trips experiences. From meteorologists, to chemists, to leaders in STEM education, we engaged our students to think beyond their present circumstances and to the future. We challenged our students to come up with solutions to problems in the world. With less than 25% of our STEM workforce being represented by black and brown faces, it became our goal to expose all students regardless of their demographics, income, race, or locality to college majors and careers centered around STEM. We were able to develop well rounded and rigorous programming in Computer Science, Engineering, Agriculture, and Health Sciences.

It was then I began to see the connections from STEM education to the needs of our career and technical education (CTE) programs in the State. We as education stakeholders must begin exposing our students to opportunities that will bridge the gap between secondary education and the workforce. We must create opportunities for our high school and college graduates to want to stay home in Louisiana to work and thrive instead of leaving the State taking with them valuable skills and industry-based certifications. I live by the mantra that kids cannot be, what they cannot see, so the creation of internships, job shadowing opportunities, and career awareness programs are essential in creating a pipeline to career and technical education pathways. Partnerships with industry and local businesses are all ways to create better outcomes for our students beyond high school.

A path to a brighter future for our State and our children is through teamwork with all education stakeholders. I believe that all students can and will succeed. One thing I would never trade about being a school leader is the moment kids and parents realize that you're on their team and have their backs! When relationships are authentic, we can begin to move educational boulders and break barriers that prevent student success.
